

Admission Requirements & Application Process



HOW TO APPLY

(Please note that students who do not meet these requirements will still be considered for admission.)

UNDERGRADUATI

- GPA equivalency of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Proof of English language proficiency with minimum scores of 61 on TOEFL, or 5.5 on IELTS.

GRADUAT

- GPA equivalency of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Proof of English language proficiency with minimum scores of 81 on TOEFL, or 6.5 on IELTS.

Graduate entrance exams such as the GRE or GMAT are not required.

GRADUATE

- Statement of Purpose that specifically explains what program you are applying to and why you want to attend Concordia University Ann Arbor.

AFTER ADMISSION

- Proof of funding for a minimum of one year of study in the form of a bank statement, loan, etc. If a relative or parent is sponsoring you, please submit a letter of support to accompany the funding. (Proof of funding must be mailed through postal mail to the university.)
- Upon acceptance to the University, a \$250 non-refundable deposit is required. (This is not an additional fee but a payment that secures your spot at the university and is put towards your tuition upon arrival.)

English as a Second Language (ESL)

Intensive English for Conditionally Accepted Students to Concordia University Ann Arbor

The Michigan Language Center (MLC) offers 6-week sessions to students who are conditionally accepted to Concordia University in Ann Arbor who need to improve their English language skills prior to beginning their academic studies at CUAA. Students live on CUAA's campus and attend the MLC classes 20 hours per week, have 2 to 4 hours of homework each evening and their progress is carefully monitored throughout the session.

Class levels offered by the MLC

A student may begin studying at the MLC at any of the following levels depending on the result of the placement test.

- Low Beginning
- 2) Beginning
- 3) Intermediate
- Advanced Intermediate
- 5) Advanced

A typical student studies at each level for two 6-week sessions. Students' progress to the next level based on class grades and examinations.
